

Public Information Meeting

The Milwaukee County Department of Transportation and Public Works has scheduled a public information meeting to present information and gather public comments on the rehabilitation of W. Good Hope Road from N. 76th Street to the Canadian Rail crossing just east of N. Teutonia Avenue, and from the Milwaukee River to N. Port Washington Road.

The meeting will be held in an open-house format. The open-house format provides citizens an opportunity to express their concerns regarding the project, and to view exhibits and meet individually with personnel from Milwaukee County Department of Transportation and Public Works (Milwaukee DTPW) and TN & Associates, Inc. (Milwaukee DTPW design consultant).

The purpose of the project is to rehabilitate the existing pavement, which is deteriorated. Signal upgrades will be made at several intersections, and offset left turn lanes will be added at N. 43rd Street, N. Teutonia Avenue, and N. River Road to provide improved visibility for left turning vehicles. Many of the side street intersections will have exclusive left turn lanes. In addition, some sidewalk replacements will be made. The project will not expand the capacity of W. Good Hope Road, and will not extend beyond the existing right of way.

Construction is scheduled for 2008, and is expected to last approximately 6 months. While the eastbound lanes are under construction eastbound traffic will be shifted to the existing west bound lanes, where one lane of traffic will be open in each direction. After the eastbound lanes are completed, all traffic will be moved to these completed lanes, and the westbound lanes will then be constructed. Access to all properties will be maintained during construction.
